• Bob Hughes: Judging Criteria for the Monmouth County Fair Honey Show

As a honey show judge for many years, Bob prepared some "tips" for members who intend to prepare honey show entries:

Moisture content must be between 15.5% and 18.6%.

Honey is also judged on flavor and aroma. There are 4 divisions within the bracket.

Be sure that your honey is free from suspended particles, pollen and bubbles.

The containers must be clean and the fill lines should be uniform.

The inside of the cap should be free from dirt.

Do not extract more than 25% of honey that is uncapped.

Honey should be extracted on the same day that it is removed from the hive to prevent it from absorbing more moisture from the air.

Wax entries should be smooth – no bumps/cracks or dirt.

Honey frames should have cells filled/no cracks.
